THE CONTROVERY BEGINS!

When we were kids some of us played a game called "whisper down the lane." For those of you who have forgotten how it was played, I'll refresh your memory. We started by arranging as many of us that wanted to play in a circle sitting on the ground or around a table. Each person in turn would write down a phrase on a piece of paper then whisper the written phrase into the ear of the kid next to them. After the last kid heard the phrase he would say it out loud. The originator of the phrase would then read the original phrase. We would all usually have a good laugh and be amazed at how different the phrase would be from the original version. The distortion of the spoken word happened within a few minutes before our very eyes and ears. You can imagine what can happen to the spoken word over a period of lets say, "fifty years."

The spoken word has been and will continue to be a source of many controversies.

A recent letter to the JJ from Andy Commentucci is a prime example of what fifty years can do to the memory and the spoken word.

THE ANGEL SPECIAL: With all due respect to the story, "Remembering A Fall Classic!

When I received the fall edition of the JJ I happened to be on jury duty and didn't get a chance to read it. My good friend Chuck, (Cam, Chuckaboot), called me and ask if I read the JJ. I told him I did not. After reading it and talking to other football players who played that day we have a different story. This letter was inspired and approved by Chuck Massara #13, Mickey Parillo #11, Ritchie Dermont #20, Tony Sciette #21, and Jean Felice for the late Jack Larue #3, Eda Nanni and Coletta Parrillo.

First, we did not win the championship game, and Chuck made the only touchdown for the Angel's that

day. Second, we did make the playoff game by making the most first downs with the Angel Special. The Angel Special was a very special pass play. The receiver fakes blocking the defensive safety or back, falls down, gets up and runs for the end zone. There was only one quarter back that could make this pass it was Chet Laurenzi #5 and the ball was passed to vours truly Andy Commentucci #8, Tucci. In fact, we didn't even practice for the playoff game. We visited our opponent's field of practice and laughed at them and told them how we were going to beat them. Arty Giar or Cat, would always say we practiced with our combs. The back of our hair was combed in a ducks ass that was the style in those days. And another thing, Jack Larue did not break his leg in the playoff game. In fact he broke his leg at Ditman & Decatur Streets that is now called Holmensburg Field. We were playing the York Truckers at the time and the enclosed picture of the Angels was taken that day. It is also the day that Jack Larue #3 broke his leg. Also in the playoff game Bobby Lucarine, Lukie was the quarterback and now you know the rest of the story with no spin added!!!!!

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to Andy Commentucci for taking the time to respond to the JJ about this recent article. I published Andy's letter unedited as promised. However, to help clear up the point about the articles accuracy I have the following explanation. The lead stories that are written by me are all <u>fact based fiction</u>. This means that many liberties are taken to somehow look back, "Through Rose Colored Glasses." The JJ gives, "The Past A Future", by exercising "poetic license" or as Andy, et al wrote, "putting a spin on it" and by eliminating the negatives no matter how trivial they may seem.

The research time that I spent on the article of Andy, et al's response was over twenty-five hours. This included two trips to the main branch of the Philadelphia Library and various conversations with people mentioned in the article. The names that I chose to use in the article were all names that I found in the microfilm files of, "The North Penn Chat." I researched from 1953 to 1958 with very sketchy results. The championship game was not mentioned in any of the Chats that I researched, but the actual plays that I wrote about in the article were exactly as they occurred in the various articles from a combination of various games. The fact about the first down winning decision was from pure memory as a young boy, so I thank Andy, et al for attesting to it, but not one person that I interviewed could collaborate that it even happened, let alone occurred in the championship game. The reason I chose to single out some of the Guys, such as, Billy McConnel, and Jack Larue were for personal sentiment.

Rocky Gianinni is unquestionably one of the finest athletes to have come out of our neighborhood and I hope to soon do a feature story about him.

There were many negative comments made to me during the interviews that I conducted and I harbor a few of my own about the guys from that era, but I chose to ignore all of them. I thought it was particularly curious that not one person I spoke to could remember if you won or lost the championship game. I thought it would be better if everyone who reads the JJ remember what occurred that fall back in 1953 as a positive experience. Aaron Rossi Domenico
